### 4.1 Description of first aid measures

General: In all cases of doubt, or when symptoms persist, seek medical attention. Never give anything by mouth

over the treatment.

Ingestion: If swallowed, seek medical advice immediately and show this container or label. Keep person warm

and at rest. Do not induce vomiting unless directed to do so by medical personnel. Lower the head so

that vomit will not re-enter the mouth and throat.

### 5.3 Advice for firefighters

### 6.2 Environmental precautions

Avoid dispersal of spilled material and runoff and contact with soil, waterways, drains and sewers. ### 6.3 Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up

### **SECTION 7: Handling and storage**

### 7.1 Precautions for safe handling

Vapors are heavier than air and may spread along floors. Vapors may form explosive mixtures with air. In addition, the product should be used only in areas from which all naked lights and other sources of ignition have been excluded. ### Recommended monitoring procedures

If this product contains ingredients with exposure limits, personal, workplace atmosphere or biological monitoring may be required to determine the effectiveness of the ventilation or other control measures and/or the necessity to use respiratory protective equipment. ### 8.2 Exposure controls

### Appropriate engineering controls

### **SECTION 11: Toxicological information**

### 11.1 Information on toxicological effects
